


How much can you zoom in?




Vector PDF
A vector export keeps your strokes sharp and clear, and lets you zoom in more than a raster. It also usually results in smaller file sizes for the same level of detail. It's the ideal solution for viewing the file on a screen.

Raster PDF

This export converts all your strokes into pixels. Although it doesn't allow for as much zooming, it gives you greater reliability for printing.

It you add a pixelated picture to your canvas, it will remain pixelated, even in a vector PDF!
